Introductions, Review Agenda

President's Report

MOTION: Rich Hochberg moved to accept the following appointments as presented:

Roger Oliva as representative for the Systems Council within the Environmental Engineering Initiative Steve Dyer as representative for the Systems Council in the steering committee of the Transactions for Big Data Stephanie White as liaison for Women in Engineering Steve Dyer as representative to IEEE Cloud Computing Bob Rassa 2nd. Motion passed. M-0133

Review of TAB actions

Paolo reviewed the proposed IEEE Constitutional changes. There was a lot of discussion about this. The IEEE Board is in support, but the general feeling of TAB is to not support this. The Board of Directors wants to simplify, but it is disenfranchising the IEEE membership. The amendment was approved in November by the IEEE Board of Directors. The vote by the IEEE membership will be in August. If this passes, the Bylaws will be changed in November, and it will go into effect 30 days after the IEEE vote, so around Jan. 1.

IEEE Brain Initiative

MOTION: Roger Oliva moved to join the IEEE Brain Initiative as a technical co-sponsor. Jose Azorin 2nd. Motion passed. M-0134

Discussion: Both Roger and Jose are active in this Brain Initiative.

Greg Adamson is asking for someone to join the BoG of Society on Social Implications of Technology (SSIT) as a non-voting member. There was discussion. Bob Lyons is a member of SSIT. It was decided that they need to join the council, and that can be our interaction.

ACTION ITEM: Paolo Carbone/Bob Lyons – Talk to SSIT and find out more information regarding their request for a Council rep to join their BoG. We cannot join as a rep, but should invite them to join our council and Bob Lyons can be their Rep to the Council. AI-0299

IoT Initiative

(Presentation: 12April2016_IoT_Transition_Meeting_Summary_Final)

Steve Holt attended a recent meeting on behalf of the Systems Council. If we were to join, it would be a commitment of \$6,000 per year for 3 years. We need to see our financial picture first. There was a lot of discussion. The transition plan is in the works.

Finance Report Holt/Rubin

(Presentation: IEEE SC Budget Present_21 April 2016)

Steve Holt presented about VP Finance, and areas of responsibility. VP Finance has responsibility for budget planning and monitoring. Treasurer approves all expenses.

Bob Rassa presented the numbers. (Presentation: SysCouncil Finance ReportApril2016 v2)

We received income from Cloud Computing \$1,851 and Big Data \$2,261.

The Systems Council is solvent.

Travel reimbursement policy.

(Presentation: IEEE Travel Expense Voucher)

The Council pays for Officers' travel, the Member Societies pay for the member rep travel.

Chapters Update White/Hochberg

Rich reviewed the chapters and joint chapters, and potential chapters.

ACTION ITEM: John Schmalzel/Bob Rassa/Rich Hochberg - Follow up with starting a chapter at Rowan. Al-0300

ACTION ITEM: Rich Hochberg - Send Judy a current list of active chapters. AI-0301

It is easy to change a chapter to a joint chapter. There was discussion regarding what strategy we want: joint chapters or stand-alone chapters? As the role of the Systems Council, it only makes sense to form joint chapters, however, another point of view was, this dilutes the Systems area. In order to serve our community, stand-alone chapters should be the choice.

Distinguished Lecturer Program

White

(Report: Systems Council DL)

Stephanie reviewed the recent Distinguished Lectures.

We have invited some Tutorial speakers from the Systems Conference to become DLs.

Andy Chen is willing to become a DL, as he travels a lot.

ACTION ITEM: Stephanie White – Arrange paperwork with Andy Chen to help him apply to be a DL for the Council. AI-0302

Publications/Journals

Dyer/Piuri

(Presentation: Systems Council Spring 2016 AdCom Publications Report 19April2016(1))

Vincenzo Piuri presented that we have a significant backlog with the Systems Journal, around 3,000 pages, (around 400 papers) and there is a need to increase the page count.

From 2015, the extra page charges have been collected. Before that, there was confusion, and payment was not enforced. Currently, we have 8 complimentary pages.

No special issues until the middle of 2017, in order to address our backlog.

Open Access – We must choose which model we want for Open Access:

- 1. Accept/Pay/Publish
- 2. Accept/Publish/Pay

Both processes are accepted by IEEE. This decision will not affect our revenue, as we only have three open access papers. It is more about the image of the Council.

MOTION: Bob Rassa moves that we accept the "Accept/Publish/Pay" model for Open Access, and establish a suitable penalty for non-payment. Rich Hochberg 2nd. Motion passed. M-0135

MOTION: Bob Rassa moves to allocate \$15,000 for additional pages to the Journal for 2017. Steve Dyer 2nd. Motion passed. M-0136

For 2016, we need to decide on the extra pages, and the IoT Initiative (\$6,000 per year for 3 years). Can we negotiate a lower amount, as seed money?

There was discussion on whether to spend our money on our programs (student programs were specifically mentioned, specifically a competition, or something that will really engage students), or on something like IoT. It was pointed out that many of our member societies are very much involved in IoT, and can keep Systems Council engaged. It was decided not to engage with IoT at this time.

ACTION ITEM: Paolo Carbone/Steve Holt – Go back to IoT and say we are not joining now, but ask what are our options for the future, and to please keep us informed. AI-0303

MOTION: Bob Rassa moved to allocate \$10,000 for additional pages to the Journal for 2016. Steve Dyer 2nd. Motion passed. M-0137

Bob Rassa recommended that we set up a Student Program effort and see if we get any candidates.
