# New Policies about Fellow Process

*Highlights of Fellow Manual revision approved by IEEE BoD in June 2017*

- ▶ Entire ST/C Fellow Evaluating Committee must be appointed by January 31
  - **S/TC Presidents** to inform Fellow Chair/Fellow Activities Staff of FEC Chair and **entire roster by January 31<sup>st</sup>** - deadline very important for early start of evaluations and avoiding that evaluators take up nominator or reference role
  
- ▶ Alignment of practices to those of other IEEE Committees (see “[Revision of the Fellow Committee Operations Manual](#),” *IEEE Technical Activities – Society Sentinel*, vol. 22, No. 15, Aug. 9, 2017).
  - Chair/Vice-Chair(s) shall be appointed by S/TC Board of Governors upon recommendation of the President
  - Roster shall be publicly available on the S/TC web site
  - **Clearly articulated term limits for Members, Chairs, and Vice Chairs (see Fellow Manual)**
    - **Chair: max 2 consecutive years**
    - **Members/Vice Chairs: max 3 consecutive years**
  - Duties of a committee Chair clarified and aligned to IEEE practices (see Fellow Handbook)
    - Chair assigns Evaluators to each Nominee, but shall not perform evaluations nor score Nominees
    - Chair will solicit approval/consensus of evaluations by the entire FEC
    - Chair submits “as is” what is approved by entire FEC

Recommend By-Law Changes to be in Compliance  
with IEEE By-Laws 1.304.4/5/6

- **Unless otherwise stated, terms are intended to be one-year terms**
- **Chairs shall not serve more than two consecutive terms**
- **Chairs may serve as Evaluators for one additional year, immediately after having served as Chair**
- **Evaluators and Vice-Chairs (if any) shall not serve for more than three consecutive years**
- **Members shall not serve for more than Five consecutive years, regardless of position**
- **Fellow evaluation Chair and evaluators shall be approved by the AdCom, upon recommendation of the President, no later than 31 January**

# In Conclusion

- **Recommend approval of these By-Law changes by the AdCom, and then be submitted to the IEEE TAB for final approval to the By-Laws.**

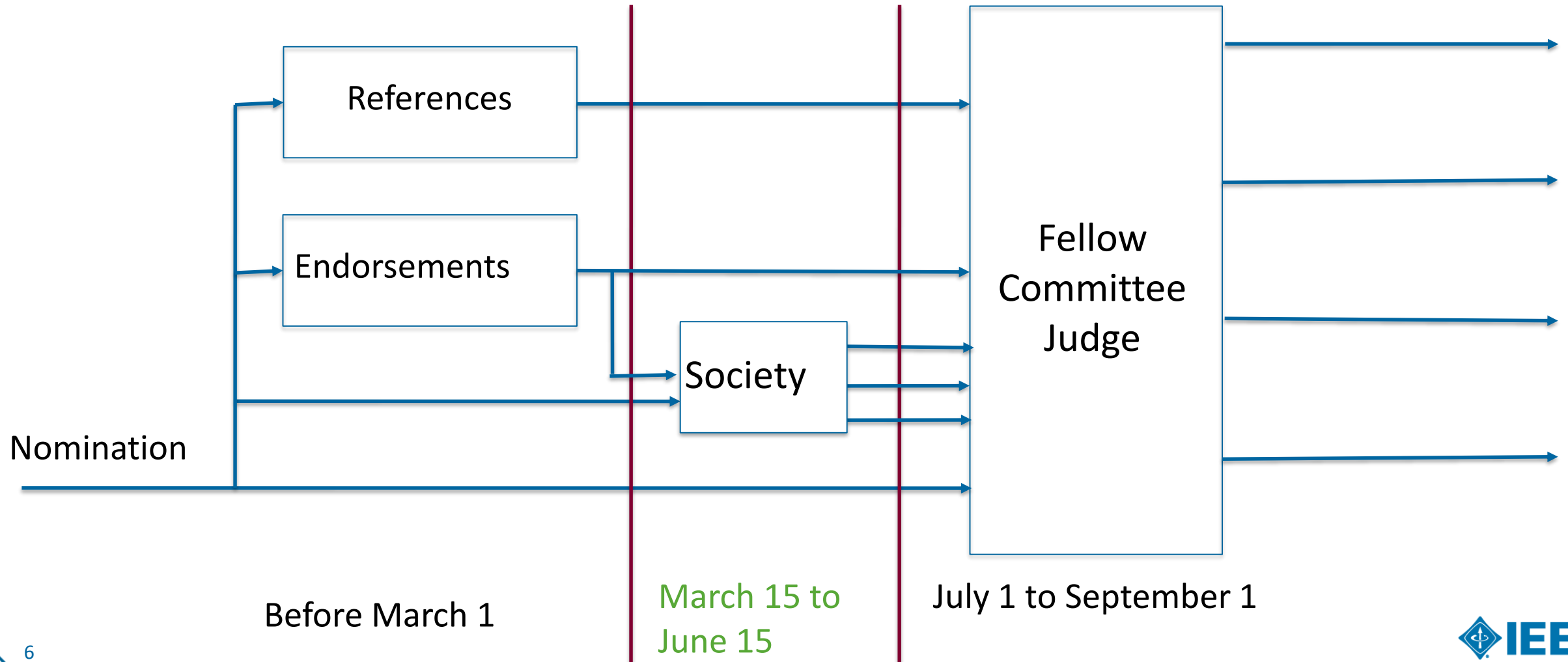

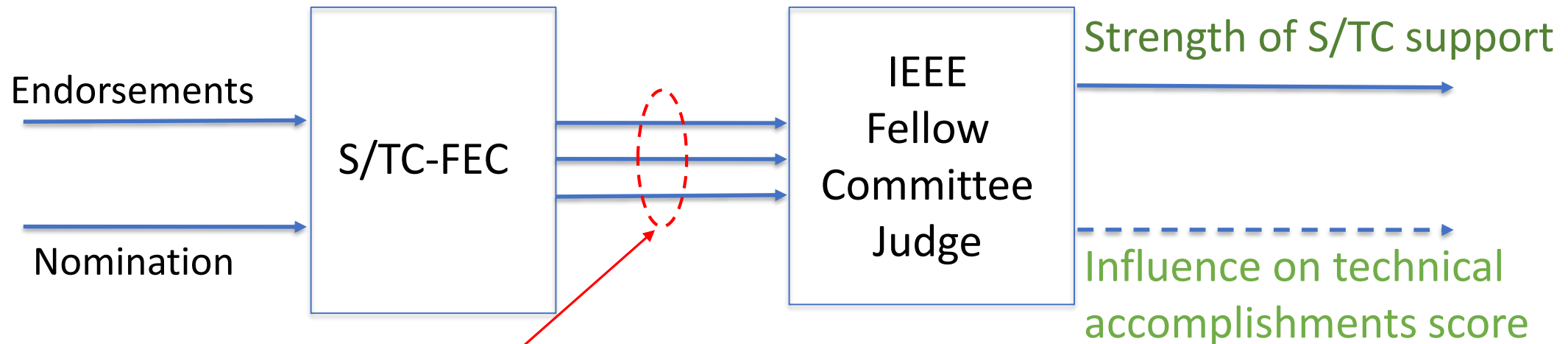
## Some Details about the Fellow Process

## Some Details about the Fellow Process

*A close-up of the S/TC FEC role*



- 1) A ranking of nominees
- 2) An “absolute” score 0-100
- 3) Narrative answer on Nominee’s contributions and impact
  - Must be consistent with score/ranking

7 - Evaluators’ independent technical assessment, but sometimes a copy and paste from Nomina

## Some Details about the Fellow Process

### *The Importance of Having Distinct Roles*

- ▶ **Reference letters**
  - Support from someone well-versed in the specific field
  - Chosen by the nominator to advocate for the Nominee
  
- ▶ **Endorsement letters**
  - Convey additional information complementing the Nomination form
  - Chosen by the nominator to inform S/TC Evaluators and Judges
  
- ▶ **Society/Technical Council Fellow Evaluating Committees**
  - Comparative ranking from a group with a broader view of field
  - The S/TC is chosen by the nominator
  - Both an independent assessment and an advocate
  - Often capable of providing a more effective “big picture” of a nominee’s impact for the Fellow committee than a reference might
  
- ▶ **IEEE Fellow Committee**
  - Synthesize all input and Ranking across a wide range of disparate technical fields



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## New Policies about Fellow Process

*The clarification on confidentiality requirements*

- ▶ **Clearly articulated confidentiality requirements: Fellow nomination and evaluation data is “IEEE Confidential – Controlled Distribution” – see [IEEE Information Disclosure Policy](#)**
- ▶ **There must be no communication between the S/TC Fellow Evaluating Committee members and any other S/TC Committee, e.g. Fellow Search Committee, Technical Committee, etc.**
- ▶ **No person external to the S/TC FEC, except of course the IEEE FC, may receive information about Nominations and their evaluations nor provide any input about Nominees to the S/TC FEC**
- ▶ **If S/TC FEC does not have the necessary expertise to assess a given Nominee, then additional S/TC FEC members should be added**

## New Policies about Fellow Process

*Other recent policies in force*

- ▶ **Reduced number of references from 5-8 to 3-5, implementation next year**
- ▶ **Feedback to nominators of low-ranked (600+) unsuccessful nominees, with feedback limited to ranking area ⑨ hope to elicit self-restraint in resubmission of nominations**
- ▶ **Recommendation for S/TC FEC and IEEE FC to have diverse composition, industry academia mix, etc.**
- ▶ **IEEE FC term limits:**
  - **Chair/Vice Chair: up to two consecutive one-year terms (same as before)**
  - **Members: up to two consecutive **two**-year terms (new)**

## Very important clarification about new policies

*ONLY the mechanics of the process have changed!*

- ▶ **Evaluation Criteria and Principles have NOT changed**
  - However, they have been better clarified
- ▶ **Evaluation Criteria and Principles still apply to BOTH S/TC Evaluators and IEEE Judges!**
- ▶ **Evaluation Criteria and Principles (Fellow Manual)**
  - Nominees must have verifiable evidence of individual technical contributions and their impact
  - The impact must be already evident, not potential
  - Contributions by practitioners in the application of engineering, science, and technology shall be accorded equal recognition with theoretical developments
  - Significance of contributions and their evidence depends on Nomination Category (e.g., publications less important for AE/P and TL)
