## SRC REPORT

#### **Recommendations to Council**

- 1. The SCRC recommends that the Council revise its webpage and place the FOI in a more prominent location.
- 2. The SCRC recommends that the Council annually produce an operational plan to take forward their strategy, and on this plan they should indicate individuals responsible and delivery schedule for each identified task.
- 3. The SCRC recommends that since the Council will increase the number of Journal AEs, it should use this as an opportunity to continue its initiative to improve the gender diversity.
- 4. The SCRC recommends the Systems Council place action photos from conferences and events to improve interest in the Council's web presence.
- 5. The SCRC recommends that Councils could get together and present at the TAB Presidents Forum.
- 6. The SCRC recommends that the Council document its budget development process and financial monitoring process in a formal way.
- 7.The SCRC recommends that the Council consider how to engage more women and Young Professionals in the governance of the Council, including but not limited to, targeting those who participate in its conferences.
- 8. The SCRC recommends that the Council review the SCRC Effective Practices website to identify practices that could assist the Council in increasing gender diversity.
- 9. The SCRC recommends that the Council encourage member societies to assist with increasing participation of women through the representatives they select to serve on the Council's AdCom.

### PRAC REPORT

#### Recommendations

- 1) As discussed in the face-to-face review, consider revising your scope to supply potential authors with guidance as to submissions you would like to see. The current official scope does not read like a typical IEEE scope. To wit, material that appears on the journal webpage is more appropriate for a scope.
- 2) Consider changing the title of "co-EIC" to some other descriptive title, such as Deputy Editor or Associate Editor-at-Large. This is to align with the recent policy that identifies *only one* Editor-in-Chief for an IEEE periodical.
- 3) The number of Associate Editors (AEs) seems small relative to the number of submissions, resulting in an average number of 30 articles per year handled by each AE. Thus, it is recommended to increase the number of AEs for the *SCJ*.
- 4) With regard to AE make-up, it was pointed out that since the writing of this report, two female AEs have been added and several AEs from industry have been added. The leadership of *SCJ* should continue to strive to have AEs from industry, given the applications orientation of the *SCJ*, and should also continue to enlist female AEs.

## the constitution ISCUSSED ...

The constitution says (page 5): The Vice President for Publications shall appoint the Editors of the various Council publications to terms as specified in the Bylaws.

On the contrary, the bylaws say (page 3)

The term of office for Editors of the Council's Periodicals is three years, renewable once. Upon vacancy or an expiration of a term, **the President may** appoint a qualified individual to an Editor post, with advice and consent from both the Nominations and Appointments Committee and Vice President for Publications. Formal approval by the AdCom is required for all Council Editors. No Editor may serve more than six years in the same post.

It is not clear if the President appoints the EiC or the VP-publications, besides the dubious formalism: 'the President may ...'.

Possible solution: modifying the constitution and removing that phrase (on page 5):

The Vice President for Publications shall appoint the Editors of the various Council publications to
